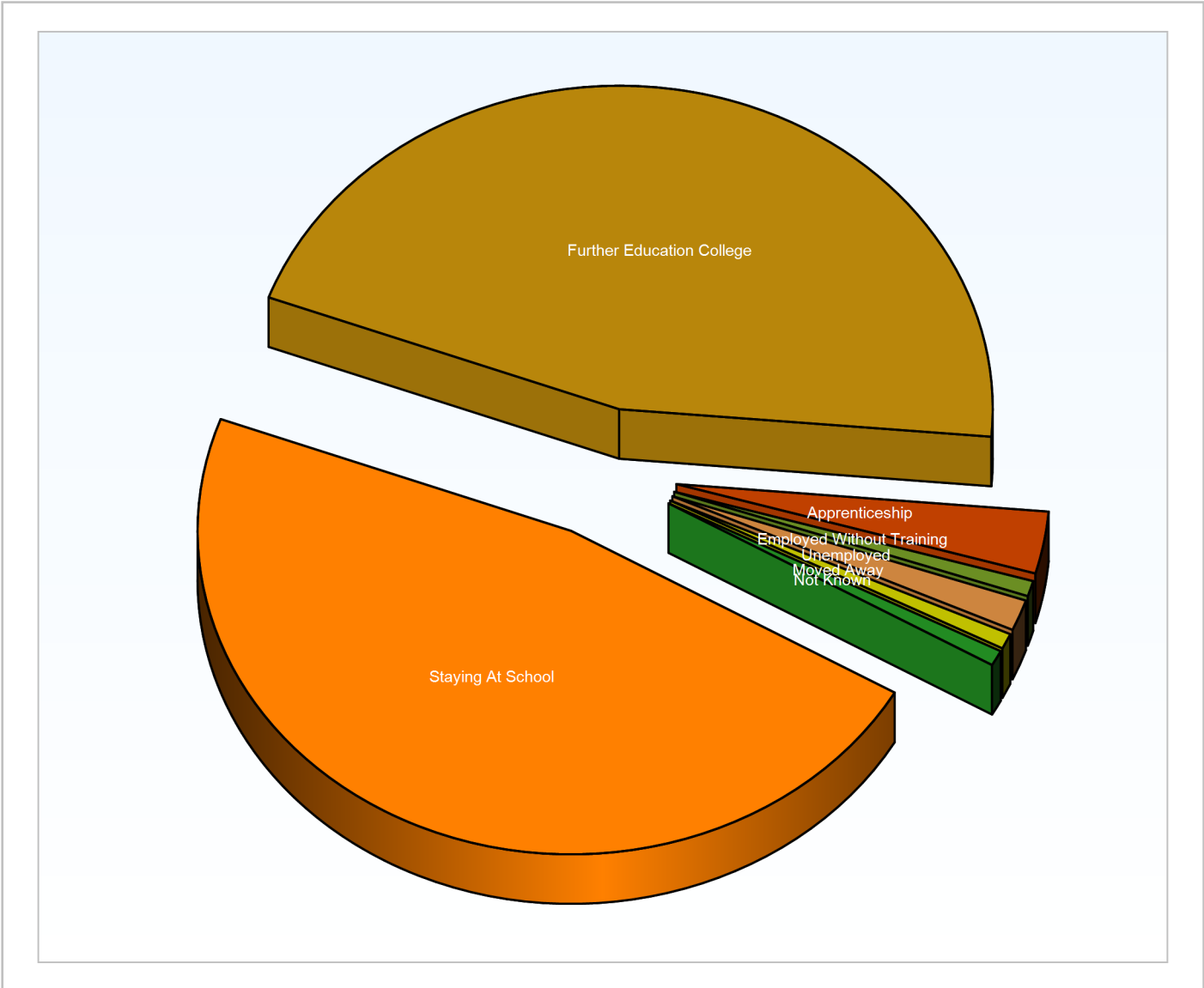

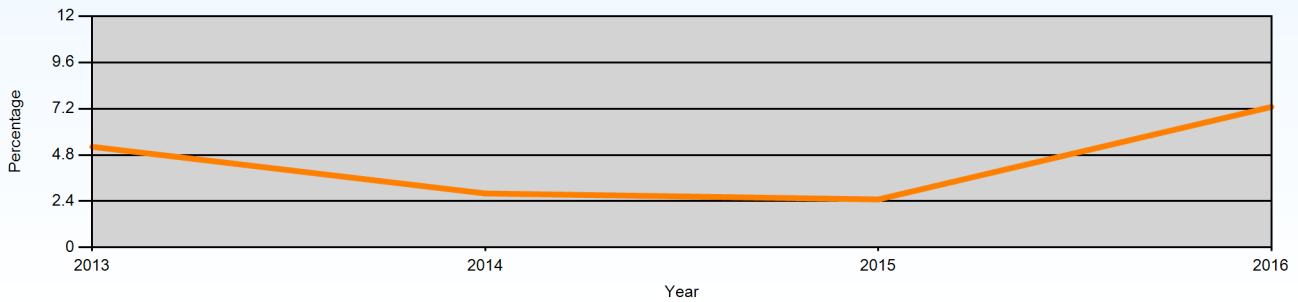

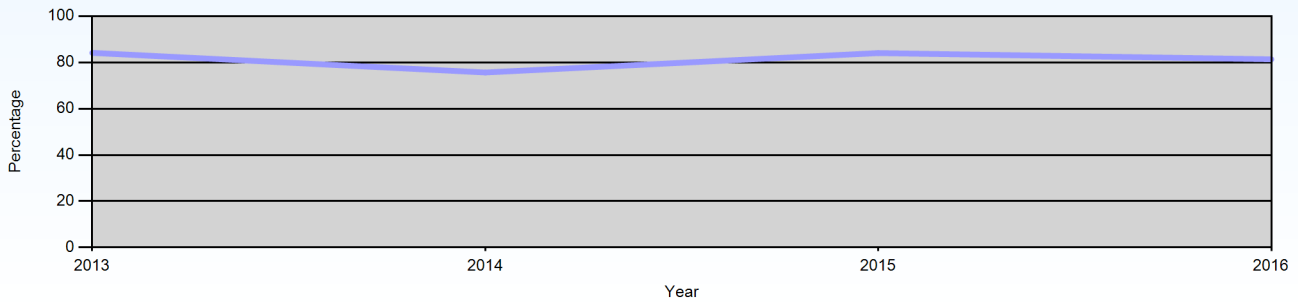

Notes

The 16-18 analysis is based on 16-18 year olds at each of the 4 years who previous left statutory education from Treviglas Community College

The NEET % for 2016 is shown without adjustment so comparisons cannot be made with previous reports which used the DfE methodology (Total NEETs as a % of the cohort less the not knowns)

The report excludes any 2016 Year 11 pupils who were notified to CSW as moved away prior to 1st June 2016

Where a young person is recorded as "Staying At School" they have entered a school 6th form (not necessarily the 6th form of their statutory school) or, in a small number of cases, repeating Year 11
